

All four varieties of the **apple trees** offered are best suited for loamy, well-drained soils and thrive in full sun locations. **POLLINATOR REQUIRED!** Cross-pollination by a different variety is key to its growing and bearing success. Plant another variety within 100' for best pollination.

**GIBSON GOLDEN DELICIOUS APPLE:** Fragrant white flowers bloom in spring, attracting local pollinators like hummingbirds and butterflies. Deliciously classic yellow apples have a honey-sweet flavor, long shelf-life, and crisp, juicy texture. Harvest mid-fall. Perfect for fresh eating, baking, cider, juice, applesauce, drying, canning, and freezing! Disease resistant. **Pollinates best with Goldrush, Honeycrisp, Red Delicious, Red Fuji, Crabapple.**

**GOLDRUSH APPLE:** Organic growers' choice! Ripens mid to late October and produces medium sized fruit with a tart, tangy flavor that sweetens with age. Excellent fresh or in pies and crisps. **Pollinates best with Red Fuji, Crabapple.**

**HONEYCRISP APPLE:** Fruit is aromatic and sweet as honey with an explosively juicy, crisp texture. Grow this naturally compact tree even in small spaces. Cold-hardy. Ripens in early September. **Pollinates best with Golden Delicious, Goldrush, Red Delicious, Red Fuji, Jonathon, Crabapple.**

**RED FUJI APPLE:** Red-streaked apples ripen in late October producing medium to large crisp, juicy, aromatic apples. Stores well. Fruit keeps up to 12 months when refrigerated. **Pollinates best with Golden Delicious, Goldrush, Honeycrisp, Crabapple.**

**FLOWERING CRABAPPLES:** Blooms late April into May with attractive flowers with colors ranging from bright white, pink, or red with glossy, dark green leaves. Great food source for bees, birds, and wildlife. Grows best in well-drained soils. Avoid planting in excessively moist areas. Full sun is the ideal condition for these trees. **Self-fertile. Can be used to pollinate apple trees.**

All three varieties of **peach trees** offered are best suited for full sun locations in well-drained soil. All three are Freestone, meaning the flesh separates easily from the pit. **All are self-pollinating**, but adding another pollinator nearby may increase the size of your crop. To produce the best fruit, peach trees should be pruned and the fruit should be thinned.

**CONTENDER PEACH**: Cold-hardy and disease resistant. Consistently yields large crops of sweet, juicy medium to large fruit. Yellow flesh is perfect for eating fresh, canning, or freezing. Blooms in the spring with an abundance of showing pink blossoms. Ripens in August.

**MD REDSKIN PEACH**: Descendent of Redhaven and Elberta peaches. Firm, juicy texture with sweet, tangy taste. Good for canning, baking, or eating fresh. Ripens late July.

**REDHAVEN PEACH**: Fragrant, pink flowers blossom in the spring. Ripens late July. Produces medium to large, sweet peaches with almost fuzzless skin over firm, cream-textured yellow flesh. Great as fresh snack, canning, or freezing.

All four varieties of **plum trees** offered are best suited for full sun locations in loamy, well-drained soil.

**OZARK PREMIER PLUM**: Produces exceptionally large, semi-freestone plums. Ripens mid to late summer. Flesh is yellow, juicy and tart. Excellent for cooking, canning, and fresh-eating. Bears young. Heat tolerant. **Cross pollination by a different variety is key to its growing and bearing success.** Plant within 100' of these varieties for best pollination: Redheart, Shiro, Santa Rosa, Methley, Superior.

**REDHEART PLUM**: Medium to large fruit features deep red skin, fine-grained, bright red, sweet flesh. Great for jams, sauces, and chutneys. Heat-tolerant. Semi-freestone. Ripens in August. **Cross pollination by a different variety is key to its growing and bearing success.** Plant within 100' of these varieties for best pollination: Ozark Premier, Methley, Shiro.

**RUBY QUEEN PLUM**: Japanese plum variety which produces delicious reddish-black plums with good disease resistance. USDA introduced this plum. Harvest late season. Large fruit with a firm texture with a sweet, juicy flavor. **In order for it to cross-pollinate, grow with another Japanese plum variety.**

**BLACK RUBY PLUM**: Japanese variety produces large, dark red skin plum with very juicy, yellow flesh. Freestone (flesh separates easily from pit). Prefers sun to partial shade. Blooms early spring/late winter. Attractive to bees, butterflies and birds. **Pollinate with different Japanese variety. Also available:**

**TREE TAG** – Aluminum, weatherproof tags with wires feature a brown cardboard backing for easy embossing with a pencil or ballpoint pen.

**WILDFLOWER MIX** of 34 northeast hardy annuals and perennials to provide years of bloom to attract a variety of birds, butterflies, and pollinators. Includes: Asters, Coneflower, Black-eyed Susan, Cosmos, Daisy, Coreopsis, Poppy and many more.

**MILORGANITE** – A useful tool in repelling deer from grazing on fruit trees and ornamental plantings. The odor of Milorganite (an organic nitrogen fertilizer) keeps deer away. Hang a small bag in each tree or spread around plantings to deter deer.
